Eat Well, Be Well

Hi everyone! Easter is almost here which, for my friends and I, means an Easter potluck. We always do brunch together and these pancakes are the perfect recipe! They're light and citrusy and even have a little extra protein from the ricotta. Enjoy!

Lemon Ricotta Pancakes

Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 Tbsp baking powder
- 3 Tbsp white sugar
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 cup milk
- ½ cup ricotta cheese
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 Tbsp lemon juice
- 1 Tbsp lemon zest

Directions:

In a large bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, sugar, and salt.

In a medium-sized bowl, mix together milk and ricotta until well blended. Add the eggs one at a time, mixing well after each egg. Then add the vanilla, lemon juice, and lemon zest.

Make a well in the dry ingredients and dump in the wet ingredients. Fold in the wet ingredients gently, until just combined. You don't want to overmix! Heat your pan over medium heat and grease with butter or non-stick spray.

Add pancakes to pan, about 1 cup of mix for each pancake.

Flip pancakes once you can see bubbles on the top and around the edges. Cook for 1-2 more minutes once flipped.

1941 - Muriel decided to get her driver's license, taking her driving test in a 1917 Ford and passed. Muriel has seen the many changes in the design and function of automobiles and many changes in how people



travelled over the years, from coal trains, air planes to space stations.

1939 – Dec 10, Canada entered the World War II which lasted until 1945. In that time Muriel saw many of her friends and family go off to battle in war. Some came home and sadly many did not.

1943 – March 8, Muriel and Lester Beck were wed. They stayed in Brule, living in a house purchased from her Aunt Margaret Carter. There, Muriel and Lester raised a family of 5 children: Joan (deceased), Wayne (deceased), Garry, Frank and Debra.

1969 – Man walked on the moon. Muriel sat with her family and watched on TV the first steps taken. A feat, that no one had ever imaged possible.

1980 to current – Muriel has seen new tech in the form of computers, internet, cell phones, satellites. Muriel has lived under five reigning Monarch's: King George V, King Edward VIII, King George VI, Elizabeth II and King Charles III.
