Operations Corner

It's been quite a month! April 25, 2023 at 2:23 AM I received a phone call from Willow Lodge saying the fire alarm had been activated, and there was water and smoke coming from the family dining area. I didn't know what to expect when I got here. We started calling in staff and activated our Emergency Evacuation Plan. Residents were moved to the Boardroom while we waited for the school buses to arrive. In the meantime the fire department went to work to try to figure out what was happening. It turned out that there was in fact a fire in the small dining area, and the heat from the fire had activated the sprinkler system and put the fire out. There was water and smoke everywhere. The fire department managed to get the water shut off and Service Master arrived very quickly and began cleaning up the mess.

The evacuation went very smoothly, we all worked together as a team and got everyone moved as quickly as we could. Everyone remained calm throughout the process, which helped a lot. It was clear how important practicing mock disasters and fire drills are. Nobody likes doing them, but it is important to know what to do, and this showed that you all know what to do.

Since that night there has been a lot of work going on to get things back to normal. The small dining area has been gutted to the studs and concrete floor. New electrical and drywall has been installed, and it is now almost ready for paint and flooring. The Chapel area had some damage as well which led to the removal of the flooring and some of the drywall. The Main Lounge, Café, as well as the Care Director's office, hair salon and Ward Clerk's office will have the baseboards and flooring removed and replaced. There is a lot of water damage in the lower level as well, mostly stained ceilings and lifted flooring. So quite a bit left to do, but it is coming along and hopefully things will get cleaned up and opened back up for us all to enjoy very soon.

Thanks again to all that helped that night, many of us were awoken and/or came in on days off and worked tirelessly to get our Residents to safety. Hopefully something like this never happens again, but we are prepared and we know what to do if it does. Let's keep practicing just to be sure.

Almost forgot to mention that we'll be receiving a delivery of new mattresses next week.
