

Family and Friends of Willow Lodge,

As we prepare to receive the COVID 19 vaccine for our residents, care partners, and designated caregivers, I cannot help but be reminded of the proverb coined by the English Theologian Thomas Fuller;

"The Darkest Hour is Just Before the Dawn".

It is the hope that the worst part of this COVID experience is behind us! Hope is on the horizon... Our consent forms have been obtained for our residents. Our Director of Care Lisa Hodder RN and Resident Care Coordinator Audrey Weatherby RN, have received additional formal training in immunology and also federal documentation program, for the administration of this vaccine. We are ready; we are waiting and as soon as the vaccine arrives, our clinic for residents will begin. Staff members will be receiving their vaccine in Truro at the Colchester East Hants Health Centre. Designated Care Providers will be contacted to receive their vaccine here at Willow Lodge, once we obtain the vials.

Many families have made inquiries regarding the time line for the vaccine roll out. I have attached the link that outlines the three phases of distribution.

A reminder to remain vigilant as we are seeing numbers rise here in the province. Wear your mask, wash your hands and remember to remain physically distant while socially close.

Ingredients

1 cup butter, softened

1 cup packed light brown sugar

½ cup white sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1 ½ cups all-purpose flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp ground cinnamon

½ tsp. ground cloves

½ tsp salt

3 cups rolled oats

1 cup raisins

Spicy Oatmeal Raisin Cookies



Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Step 2

In a large bowl, cream together the butter, butter flavored shortening, brown sugar, white sugar, eggs, and vanilla until smooth. Combine the flour, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves, and salt; stir into the sugar mixture. Stir in the oats and raisins. Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets.

Step 3

Bake 10 to 12 minutes until light and golden. Do not overbake. Let them cool for 2 minutes before removing from cookie sheets to cool completely. Store in airtight container. Make sure you get some, because they don't last long!

The residents couldn't help but come back for seconds when they helped make these

delicious cookies one afternoon!
