# Eat Well, Be Well

Happy August! Blueberry season is here and that's definitely a reason to celebrate. This muffin recipe includes Greek yogurt and rolled oats, adding a little extra nutrition to a classic! I hope you enjoy.

#### **Blueberry Yogurt Muffins**

## Ingredients:

1 cup plain Greek yogurt

½ cup milk

1/3 cup honey or maple syrup

1 egg

2 Tbsp vegetable oil

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 cup rolled oats

3/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp cinnamon

½ tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

1 cup blueberries (fresh or frozen)



#### Directions:

Preheat your oven to 375 degrees and grease your muffin tin or line with liners.

In a large bowl, mix together Greek yogurt, milk, honey, oil, and vanilla. Set aside.

In a small bowl, mix together oats, flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, and salt.

Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients and mix.

Fold in the blueberries until just combined.

Fill your muffin tin using about ¼ cup of batter for each muffin.

Bake for 18-20 minutes or until a toothpick poked into the centre of a muffin comes out clean.

Let cool for 10 minutes and enjoy!
